reflexive pronouns

We use **reflexive pronouns** when the subject and the object are the same person.

e.g. *He taught **himself** Spanish.*
*I washed **myself** quickly.*

I – myself [maɪ'self]

we – ourselves [aʊə'selvz]

you – yourself [jʊ:'self]

you – yourselves [jʊ:'selvz]

he – himself [hɪm'self]

they – themselves [ðeɪm'selvz]

she – herself [ʃi:'self]

it – itself [ɪt'self]

The reflexive pronouns are myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, ourselves, yourselves and themselves.

Where can you see yourself?

I can see myself in a mirror.

Do you think I talk to myself?

Yes, I think you sometimes talk to yourself.

Do you talk to yourself a lot?

No, I don't talk to myself a lot.

Does she talk to herself a lot?

No, she doesn't talk to herself a lot.

Does he talk to himself a lot?

Yes, he talks to himself a lot.
