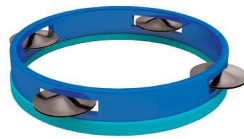

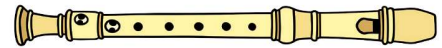

No, the harmonica doesn't have strings.



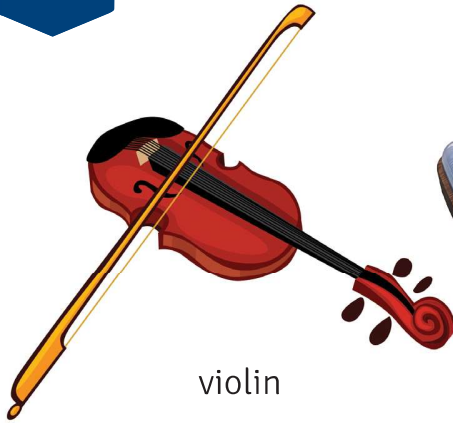
